### **Brief History**

- Chartered in 1934 as Porter University
  - Changed name to Jacksonville Junior College in 1935
- College finds permanent home in 1950
  - The same year, JJC receives full accreditation from Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Learning
- JJC becomes Jacksonville University in 1961 when JU becomes a fully accredited four-year institution

Dr. Frances B. Kinne becomes the first female
 University President in the state of Florida and the second in the nation at JU in 1980







Jacksonville University is governed by a Board of Trustees. This Board is made up of over 30 members of JU alumni, community leaders and business leaders.


Their responsibilities include:

- Reviewing adherence to the Mission and Vision


The President has ten Chief Officers who report directly to him including the Chief Academic Officer, the Chief Student Life Officer, and the Chief Administrative Officer

#### Academic Affairs Organizational Chart




### Nellie the Dolphin
